Commission on Equity and Inclusion Releases Fiscal Year 2024 BEP Annual Expenditure Report

Springfield, IL, March 11, 2025 — The Commission on Equity and Inclusion (CEI) has released its Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24) Annual Expenditure Report for the Business Enterprise Program for Minorities, Women, and Persons with Disabilities (BEP), in accordance with Section 8f of the Business Enterprise for Minorities, Women, and Persons with Disabilities Act (BEP Act). This report showcases the State of Illinois' (State) progress in supplier diversity and identifies the FY24 BEP achievements of State agencies, boards, commissions, and public institutions of higher education subject to the BEP Act.
