Illinois Higher Education Diversity Report Narrative

Eureka College was founded by abolitionists from Kentucky who were members of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Those pioneers believe in an education infused with values as a basis for leadership. Chartered by the Illinois Legislature in 1855, Eureka was the first college in the state and third in the nation to admit men and women on an equal basis. Diversity was then, and continues to be today, one of the core values at Eureka College.

While our location in central Illinois provides limited access to minority-owned, women-owned, and veteran-owned businesses, we have actively been reaching out to organizations that fall under these classifications by utilizing the CMS certified director. With limited capital funds available for capital projects on campus, we have mostly been limited to business that can help operationally. We expect that our supplier diversity will grow in the coming years as capital funding becomes available. Our goal of \$33,000 for fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 is modest compared to larger institutions, but would represent a 10% increase over the previous year.

Illinois Institute of Technology is in the process of finalizing a university-wide Diverse and Disadvantaged Supplier Program. Earlier this year, we implemented an eProcurement solution, Unimarket, which enables us to better identify, track, and drive spend to our preferred supplier partners and diverse / disadvantaged vendors. This is the first year that we are setting spend goals with diverse / disadvantaged suppliers for our non-capital spending. Illinois Tech already has a 30% spend goal with minority and women-owned businesses on capital projects.

For Fiscal Year 2020 (June 1, 2019 through May 31, 2020), our objectives are to identify and encourage spend through diverse / disadvantaged suppliers both directly and at the tier II level through preferred supplier partnerships, with the aim of achieving a total spend goal of \$9M for the fiscal year, which is approximately 4% of our total budget of \$248M for FY20, inclusive of salary, benefits, operating, and capital spend. Please note that 60% of our total annual budget goes towards compensation for our faculty and staff, leaving \$100M in the university's expense base.

We have provided below a supplemental diverse supplier spend calculation table using \$100M (meaning it includes only nonpersonnel and capital spend) as the spend base for FY2020.

To date our systems and programs have not collected or considered vendor ownership. The report that is provided reflects limited information that we have in order to even complete such a request. This method is certainly flawed. It will take some time and some technology changes for us to begin to collect this information in a manner that will be helpful to the supplier diversity goals of the state. For this reason, we are not providing a goal at this time.

We request clarification on what is considered a vendor and how this calculation should be approached. In our list we have included our long term debt payments, Not-for-Profit vendors and publicly traded companies, which skews the data as the state provided list does not include all of those entities. We did exclude any employee benefits or reimbursements that were made.

The program, when developed and fully implemented, and consistent with all applicable laws, will require the university to purchase ethically, fairly, and without conflict of interest, where institutional procurement processes seek the best value and support the development of businesses that are woman-owned, minority-owned or owned by persons with disabilities. The program shall be developed and operated in accordance with the university's Code of Ethics and Rules of Conduct, as published in the *Policy Handbook for Non-Instructional Staff* at Sects. 2.4.1 and 2.4.2.

The University recognizes the importance of increasing the participation of businesses owned by minorities, females and persons with disabilities and is dedicated to doing so. All employees engaging in purchasing activity for the University shall make reasonable efforts to use qualified minority, female and persons with disabilities for such activities.

FY 2020 Goal:

Our goal for the year is a five percent increase over last fiscal year. Our budget is approximately \$101M, though no more than 20% of this amount is available to achieve supplier diversity goals. For example, most of the budget is consumed by major expenses such as personnel, debt service and utilities. And despite efforts to maintain and cut costs in many discretionary areas, spend with minority, female and persons with disabilities from FY18 to FY19 increased from \$307K to \$402K.

The School of the Art Institute is undertaking the following initiatives to increase diversity and inclusion in our supply chain.

- A Supplier Diversity Advisory Council was created in FY19. The council is composed of senior management from a variety of departmental areas. These departments reflect some of the largest spend categories and greatest opportunity for supplier diversity. Council members serve as champions to make supplier diversity an integral part of how we conduct business, foster inclusive procurement, and support local economic growth. The Council is working with the procurement team to create an aggressive plan to enhance diverse suppler outreach efforts and increase diverse supplier participation and spend.
- Developing strong relationships with certifying organizations is a priority. We are an active
 member of the Chicago Minority Supplier Development Council. Our partnership with the
 CMSDC gives us access to a large database of certified MBE's. We are also an active member
 of the Women's Business Development Center and have similar access to a database of
 certified WBE's. We routinely reach out to public sector leaders in the City of Chicago and
 Chicago Park District to gain access to supplier certification data and suggestions on ways that
 we can collaborate to improve our internal program. An internal diverse supplier database
 sorted by commodity and service types was subsequently developed for school management
 and project leaders to help them identify new suppliers for inclusive bid opportunities.
- Our outreach efforts to connect with diverse suppliers include active participation in the annual Chicago Business Opportunity Fair sponsored by CMSDC and the largest event of its type in Chicago that brings buyers and diverse sellers together. The annual Chicago Park District Vendor Networking event is another showcase that brings many city affiliated

agencies and non-profits together with diverse suppliers. We participate in CMSDC and WBDC events and topical discussions and have discovered new diverse suppliers through organized supplier meet 'n greets.

 The school has organized a number of Commodity Councils to further advance diversity and inclusion in the supply chain. Commodity Councils are comprised of subject matter experts in key commodity areas that include technology, facilities, operations, printing/marketing, construction/capital projects, etc. Commodity Council members work to leverage volumes, define standards, reduce costs, and rationalize supplier relationships and choices. A key attribute of our supplier assessments is to create a pool of preferred suppliers and master service agreements that facilitate the bid, order and fulfillment process. Procurement seeks out MBE/WBE's to include in the supplier pool with the intention of welcoming new direct Tier I suppliers to the school on an on-going basis.

Through these initiatives and the development of progress reports, school leadership and the procurement team are attempting to actively manage resources, improve communications, establish supply chain priorities and achieve greater opportunities and outcomes for diverse suppliers.

RESULTS OF THE REPORT

Since this report has utilized the institution's entire budget as the denominator, the top spend area will always be Non-Procurement expenditures. Non-Procurement expenditures include a variety of nonsupplier expenditures that include items such as academic salaries, staff salaries, benefits, depreciation, interest payments, etc. Within the supplier related categories, our top expenditure areas are Capitalized Construction, Information Technology, Buildings, Facilities & Hygiene Services, and Scientific Supplies & Services. In our view, it would be best to base this report on total procurement budget rather than the institution's total budget.

The University sets a goal of 41% (35% MBE and 6% WBE) for all construction projects, but is reflected as 1.2% since the denominator is the institution's total budget and not construction's. There are no other published diverse spend goals set for any other services/goods currently, thus no percentage or monetary amounts are reported in the table above.

OFFICE OF BUSINESS DIVERSITY OVERVIEW

The Office of Business Diversity, under the leadership of Nadia Quarles, Assistant Vice President, plays a fundamental role in increasing the University's utilization of minority and women-owned business enterprises within the goods, general services, and professional services categories. Business diversity is fundamental to the University's commitment towards growing and developing a portfolio of critical and valued business partners. Generating inclusive open competition gives the University the ability to leverage the best resources in the marketplace and increases access to the most creative and innovative talent locally and nationally.

ENCOURAGING DIVERSE SPEND

The University is committed to fostering diverse and inclusive business relationships with local and national minority and women-owned businesses.

1. Professional Services Symposium

In 2009, the Office of Business Diversity held the first Symposium dedicated to creating opportunities for minority and women-owned professional service firms. The Annual Professional Services Symposium brings prominent Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprise (MWBE) leaders from around the country together to network and build sustainable relationships with senior leadership at the University. At the two-day event, University Vice Presidents first provide departmental overviews during a pre-symposium meeting. The following day, the participating firms have a chance to interact one-on-one with our Vice Presidents and their senior teams during 45-minute business presentations. The Symposium culminates with a networking reception which gives invited guests and University leadership an opportunity to network, and features a welcome from President Robert J. Zimmer and University Trustee John W. Rogers, Jr.

Over the past 11 years, we have retained more than 90 MWBE's and spend of nearly \$52 Million within our legal, money management, financial services, communications, human resources, information technology, architecture and engineering contracts. This Symposium is viewed as a national model for other educational institutions, foundations and non-profits to emulate. We are currently looking to create goals within our communications, financial services, human resources, and IT industries.

2. UChicago Local

As the largest employer and engine for economic development on the South Side of Chicago, the University of Chicago has a deep commitment to our community. Through the UChicago Local initiative, the Office of Civic Engagement marshals the resources of the University and Medical Center to positively impact the quality of life in the neighborhoods around the University. In partnership with local organizations, we support business and career growth for local residents, housing opportunity in our community and economic growth that benefits all residents.

UChicago Local has worked with more than 300 South Side businesses to help grow their capacity and connect with opportunities at the University. Through these partnerships with community businesses, the University spends more than \$25 million on goods and services from more than 300 South Side companies.

3. Inclusive Construction Initiative

This initiative is a joint effort between the University of Chicago Office of Civic Engagement, Facilities Services, and UChicago Medicine to create opportunities for minorities, women, and local residents on campus projects.

In 2017, the University harmonized construction contracting and on-site workforce goals which include: 35% MBE and 6% WBE participation; 30% minority journey workers and apprentices, and 5% female journey workers and apprentices; 40% minority laborers and 5% female laborers. Lastly, these new enterprise-wide goals also includes 40% City of Chicago Resident worker hours.

This report includes actual spend for our top five commodities for fiscal year 2019, which ended 30 June 2019. For this period Wheaton's budget was \$148,524,106; of which the total spend on goods and services were \$24,849,000. Wheaton's total diversity spend for fiscal 2019 across all commodities was \$498,070 which represents approximately 2%.

Wheaton College's diversity supplier program has been managed on a voluntary basis for a number of years. Specific goals have never been assigned however, Wheaton College is actively engaged with professional organizations, consortiums, and peer institutions in developing a more comprehensive supplier diversity program including establishing benchmarks; expansion of diversity vendors in database; purchasing policy statement; supplier outreach and development; and a diversity supplier statement for bid requests. Wheaton College uses and will continue to improve its eProcurement system to track and report on supplier diversity participation.

Two groups of diversity suppliers are currently identified in our eProcurement system:

1. Certified – MWVBE suppliers that have one or more certifications issued by an authorized agency. Spend with these suppliers is used for reporting.

2. Uncertified – Suppliers that qualify on one or more points as MWVBE but are lacking formal certification. Spend with these suppliers is NOT used for reporting. Outreach to these suppliers will occur regularly to encourage development as certified diversity suppliers. Progress will be tracked.
