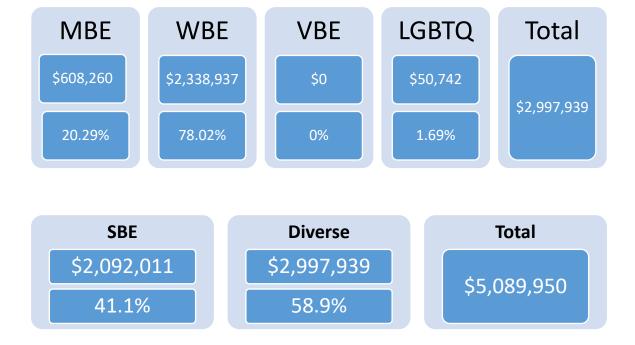

The total budgeted expenditures for the period is \$160,621,879. For purposes of clarity, this figure excludes FY20 expenditures on salaries, benefits, interest expense and bank fees, depreciation, bad debt expense, taxes and financial aid.

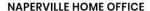

As indicated above Illinois Institute of Technology set a goal for FY 2020 of \$9,000,000. We were making progress towards meeting this goal when our operations and expenditures needed to be adjusted in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and resulting government directives. As part of its response, a number of the university's anticipated projects were cut back and several spending categories were eliminated, which impacted the university's progress towards fulfilling its stated goal. We were also unable to host the diverse/disadvantaged supplier fair initially targeted for March / April 2020 due to the city-wide stay-at-home mandate. As a result, our total spend with diverse vendors for FY20 of \$6,278,000 fell short of our target of \$9,000,000 by \$2,722,000 or approximately 30% in the five identified categories.

Despite these challenges the university made progress in driving more spend to diverse vendors in our communities, including awarding the university-wide preferred shredding contract to R4, a local and WBE company, and have over 150 diverse and disadvantaged active suppliers in our vendor base from whom campus end users can purchase through our eProcurement solution, Buy It eMarketplace. In addition to the diverse spend in the five identified categories, we also spent an estimated \$485,400

We anticipate the current Covid-19 pandemic will continue to impact our operations in FY21 (June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2021) with further pressure to reduce overall spending. However, we will continue to identify opportunities and encourage applicable spend through diverse/disadvantaged suppliers with the aim of achieving an adjusted total spend goal of \$5M in FY21 for the five categories identified in the table below

Millikin University Supplier Diversity Narrative Fiscal Year 2020 November 5, 2020 Ruby James 217-424-5071

Millikin University is committed to using local vendors whenever possible to promote the local economy. Certainly, all vendors are welcome to send solicitation materials to the University to be reviewed when certain needs arise. While the University does not have a supplier diversity program, the University is supportive of using Minority, Women, and Veteran Business Enterprise organizations whenever feasible. Millikin does not utilize a limited list of state certifications in this process. The University continually reviews vendors that are used at the University based on qualifications and pricing so that vendors would have an opportunity to be selected if qualified and are competitively priced.

Being located in central Illinois, it is more challenging to utilize diversity vendors. Millikin University has an open bidding process whereby construction contracts are publicized and bids are accepted from those who submit bids and analyzed for qualifications and competitive pricing by project. Everyone is welcome to submit bidding, and we cannot choose who will submit bids. With resources being limited as they are, the University must choose vendors that have the most competitive pricing in order for us to meet our budget and limited resources.

This may then explain the lower results in dollar amounts for diversity vendors used by Millikin University. For instance, for Dunker Electric Supply Inc. and Kurent Safety, Inc., we only have limited supplies we use at these vendors. Watts Copy Systems Inc. supplies our full services of copier needs. Resource One of Illinois Ltd. is one of our main furniture suppliers, but we do not have a large budget for furniture purchases. For the current fiscal year we spent more than double our normal furniture purchases because we built a new academic building. In next fiscal year we do not plan to spend that much in furniture. Midwest Mailing & Shipping Systems, Inc. handles our specialized shipping orders. We do utilize these vendors as much as we feasibly can since they are located in our region and represent our commitment to diversity.

During this fiscal year, we were able to increase our furniture purchases since we will be brought online our Center for Theatre and Dance. We had a significant amount of furniture that was purchased for the new building. We utilized Resource One of Illinois Ltd. because they had competitive pricing once again and we selected them as our furniture supplier in a competitive bidding process.

In the future we will continue to review the listing of Illinois State approved diversity vendors and make efforts to include Minority, Women, and Veteran Business Enterprise organizations in our procurement processes. We will also strive to set goals for spending to include these organizations.
